STREP A GUIDANCE



Common symptoms of strep A include:

- flu-like symptoms, such as a high temperature, swollen glands or an aching body
- sore throat (strep throat or tonsillitis)
- a rash that feels rough, like sandpaper (scarlet fever)
- scabs and sores (impetigo)
- pain and swelling (cellulitis)
- severe muscle aches
- nausea and vomiting

Most strep A infections are not serious and can be treated with antibiotics.

But rarely, the infection can cause serious problems. This is called invasive group A strep (iGAS).

What to do if your child is unwell

It can be difficult to tell when a child is seriously ill, but the main thing is to trust your instincts.

You know better than anyone else what your child is usually like, so you'll know when something is seriously wrong. If your child does not seem to be seriously ill, you can usually look after them at home. They should feel better in a few days.

ECONSULT

eConsult is a online form consultation and triage platform that collects your non-urgent medical or administrative request and sends it through to your GP practice to triage and decide what the right care is for you. Once received, your eConsult will be reviewed and you will receive a response within 48 hours.

PRESCRIPTIONS

Please be mindful of any upcoming bank holidays or closures when sending in your prescription requests, leaving plenty of time to ensure you have any medication you may need.
